

Perrysburg Municipal Court Annual Report 2025

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Judge Aram M. Ohanian presents the Annual Report of the Perrysburg Municipal Court. This report contains statistical information required by law to be reported to the Ohio Supreme Court, Perrysburg City Council, and the Wood County Board of Commissioners. We want to acknowledge and thank the City of Perrysburg for their support in providing the funds necessary to serve the public in 2025.

As we look back on the 2025 year, we are reminded of the many challenges that Courts are facing throughout Ohio and the country. The Municipal Court's caseload varies from year to year, at times dramatically, making forecasting difficult. Ensuring that our services meet the highest standards of our community, regardless of unforeseen circumstances, remains a constant priority. Changing perceptions and perhaps an erosion of trust in our institutions make it even more important that we do not lose sight of our mission, to serve our community and to ensure confidence in our service.

From technology adoption to adjustments in the roles and duties of staff members, the Perrysburg Municipal Court is preparing for the future. Through planning and efficient use of resources, as well as close partnership and communication with the legislative and executive branches of local government, the defense bar and other agencies, the Court has dedicated significant assets to make the community safer through use of technology as well as working with local agencies to provide services to those in need. Our successes in these programs have paid dividends, promoting our goal of reducing recidivism and allowing for future success for those who qualify.

For example, a review of one of these programs, the Theft Diversion Program, a program designed for first time, low-level offenders, shows that we can successfully change behaviors to prevent future crime. In 2021 Perrysburg Municipal Court made the decision to implement a theft diversion program for first time misdemeanor level offenders, a program that previously was only available through another Court. Our local prosecutors, my probation department and I collaborated on a new program that addresses the root causes of theft. Our program has been highly successful. We have more than tripled the number of diversions, reduced our recidivism rate to 16%, and lowered the program costs by 55%. We have made the program more accessible to individuals who may benefit from it, significantly increased participation, and 84% of the participants have not reoffended-yielding meaningful benefits both the individuals served and to our community.

The Perrysburg Municipal Court continues to advance its mission by working alongside community stakeholders to enhance public confidence in the justice systems and contribute to a strong and thriving community. Through programs such as Traveling Court (where the Court travels to other areas of our jurisdiction to hold court proceedings) to weddings (including a Valentine's Day event where couples were married in a special ceremony), volunteering at events such as the Clean Your Streams park cleanup, Food Distribution through Moms Mobile Mission Food Bank, and hosting and assisting the Junior High and High School Mock Trial teams prepare for their competitions, the Court has remained an active partner in the community.

The Court recognizes its achievements are only possible due to the dedication and professionalism of its staff and the support of the citizens of this district. As we face new challenges in 2026, we are well positioned to handle these challenges with flexibility and efficiency. Our goal is to be proactive and adaptive, and we will continue to be active contributors to our community through outreach, education, and community service.





Statistics – Criminal/Traffic


Criminal cases filed in the Perrysburg Municipal Court range from misdemeanor offenses, carrying a maximum of six (6) months in jail and a \$1,000 fine, to felony level offenses that carry greater penalties. The felony level offenses that are initially filed in the Perrysburg Municipal Court are, in most cases, bound over to the Wood County Court of Common Pleas for their final disposition.

Felony Criminal Cases Filed





Misdemeanor Criminal Cases Filed







Statistics - Civil

Civil cases filed in the Perrysburg Municipal Court involve dollar amounts up to fifteen thousand (\$15,000) dollars. These cases consist of personal injury or property damage, small claims (monetary claims of up to three thousand dollars), contracts or unpaid accounts, and forcible entry and detainer cases (evictions and landlord-tenant disputes). The Perrysburg Municipal Court's Civil Division handles other actions as well. Those include trusteeships, rent escrow, and appeals to the Bureau of Motor Vehicles for 12-point driving suspensions.

Statistics – Search Warrants, Property Dispositions, Extraditions, Rule 4 Hearings, Sealings

The Clerk of Court's Office is also responsible for processing the following filings:

- **Disposition of Property** – Law enforcement agencies are required to seek a court order for the sale, use, or destruction of old evidence. Once the property is disposed of, the agency files a return with the Court.
- **Extraditions** – Complaints for extraditions (defendants who are stopped in Wood County and who are wanted in another state for a serious criminal offense) are filed in this court. The defendant then has a right to wither waive his/her extradition and return to the other state voluntarily, or a Governor's Warrant is obtained and a hearing is set to determine the defendant's identity.
- **Rule 4 Hearings** – Rule 4 Hearings (defendants who are stopped in Wood County and who are wanted in a non-adjointing county) are filed in this court, if the defendant fails to return voluntarily.
- **Search Warrants** – Law enforcement officers must request permission to search for evidence in some instances. The search warrant records are filed and maintained in the Clerk's Office.
- **Sealing of Record** – Eligible offenders may apply for sealing of a criminal record. If granted, the record of conviction is sealed.


Court Costs Criminal/Traffic Cases

Pursuant to the Ohio Revised Code, all court costs received in criminal/traffic cases are paid to the City of Perrysburg, except for the following two portions of those costs: (a) \$9.00 per conviction or bond forfeiture to the State of Ohio Reparations Rotary Fund (for victims of crime); (b) \$20.00 per conviction or bond forfeiture to the State of Ohio Indigent Defense Support Fund (for Public Defenders) [Criminal only]; (c) \$1.50 Indigent Alcohol Treatment Fund [Traffic only]; (d) \$25.00 Indigent Defense Support Fund [Traffic only]; (e) \$.10 Justice Services Fund [Traffic only].
